## <u>Combe Reading Room – Chairman's Report</u> <u>2015</u>

The Reading Room continues to thrive largely due to the excellent support that it receives from the community it serves.

We have our usual well attended coffee mornings on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in the month. So too our summer cream tea programme which raises about £725 per participating organisation. In 2015 these were: Friends of Combe School (FOCS), Pre-School twice, the Reading Room, the Parochial Church Council (PCC), Teenage Cancer Trust and the Village Hall and Recreation Ground Committee (VH&RGC). The majority of attendees at these events come from outside the village bringing in very welcome "outside" funds. We hosted the FOCS post May Dancing event. We held the December Christmas tree lighting ceremony at which our new head teacher Charlie Marshall kindly officiated. Hire for business meetings is going very well and proving a most welcome and rewarding supplement to our income. One organisation in particular has made a block booking covering the whole year.
